

ELLIS GLENN'S TEETH.

Miss Agnes Riley, a Witness, Says She Believes They Are False.

PARKERSBURG, W. Va., July 23.—In the Ellis Glenn case to-day the first witness produced a sensation. Miss Agnes Riley, stenographer for John F. Laird, an attorney for the defense, was called to testify regarding the scar on Ellis Glenn's head. She stated that she believed the defendant, Ellis Glenn, had false teeth. This was very much unexpected, as Miss Riley was called by the defense, and the State has been contending that Ellis Glenn has false teeth. This statement created quite a scene in the court. The other witnesses gave the usual testimony that the defendant was not Elbert Glenn.

Dr. Wise made four examinations of Ellis Glenn's head and hands and has not been able to find any scar. Mr. Richter, of Williamstown, stated positively that the prisoner was not Bert Glenn, as the latter had worked for him several years and he knew him well.
