"THE OPPOSITE SEX...IS NEITHER!" KATE BORNSTEIN PERFORMS IN NORTHAMPTON AND HARTFORD

Kate Bornstein, Transsexual Lesbian performance artist, gave a moving and funny performance of "The Opposite Sex...Is NEITHER!" to a diverse and enthusiastic audience in Northampton, Massachusetts on Thursday, March 5, 1992 at the Northampton Center for the Arts. Her risky and fascinating one-person show explored an array of transgendered characters, including Female-to-Male and Male-to-Female Transsexuals, a She-Male and a woman passing as a man.

Kate's Female-to-Male characters were especially strong and believable and she has an uncanny talent for acting out FTM mannerisms, voices and emotions. She does so with the utmost respect and care and it is a huge contribution to us all to make us visible as FTMs before audiences nationwide. Kate's demonstration of the FTM who met the Tall Man Circus Freak when he was a child was one of the most moving portrayals of FTM reality I can imagine will ever be presented.

After the show, I had the pleasure and privilege of meeting Ms. Bornstein backstage. She is simply beautiful, both inside and out, and she glows with the importance and urgency of her creative work.

Once again, on Saturday, March 7, I went to see "The Opposite Sex...Is NEITHER!" This time with my wife, Lonnie. Kate appeared at the Bronson & Hutensky Theater in Hartford, Connecticut.

Although this theater was able to provide Kate's show with more special lighting effects than the theater in Northampton, the audience in Hartford seemed more reserved and less responsive than Northampton's had. Kate's performance was wonderful once again, and I begin to appreciate Kate's experience as neither a man nor a woman but as neither...more like a third reality and that is, Transsexual.

After this performance, I went backstage to introduce Lonnie to Kate. We had a good chat and Kate introduced me to an FTM and his partner who will join us in ECFTMG! Others from the XX (Twenty) Club were in attendance that night and we regretted not being able to join the MTFs and FTMs there for a midnight supper after the show. If Kate Bornstein performs in your area, DON'T MISS a wonderful time!

THE GENDER BENDER BALL

Real Art Ways (R.A.W.), a non-profit innovative art gallery in Hartford, Connecticut, presented the "Gender Bender Ball" on Saturday evening, April 4, 1992. It was an evening of cabaret-style performances including Sara Cytron (NYC lesbian comic), a group of drag queens, a punk dance band, etc. and disco and house music. The event, along with Kate Bornstein's East Coast performances, was part of "Genderama" month, a series of gender-bending art shows, performances, and events. The "Gender Bender Ball" was well attended and actually over-crowded the warehouse space where it was held. More than half of the people attending were crossdressed but it seemed that real MTFs and FTMs numbered very few. It felt more like the arts community in Hartford dressing up (or down) and being "avant-garde." After all, the dance was a R.A.W. benefit.

The event was noisy, rowdy, smoky and often the comedy was hilarious. And it was fun to "see and be seen," to be continuously photographed, to watch the the FTM and MTF drag and to watch the voyeurs there who were watching.

We wished there were more FTMs to connect with but we did have a good time talking with Storm and his partner and went home exhausted after some non-stop dancing. But all in all, for the \$15 admission price, instead of the "Gender Bender Ball" the event should have been called the "Gender Bender Screw."

FOREFATHERS

Vesta Tilley, 1864-1952

Vesta Tiley, born Matilda Powles in Worcester, England, was a celebrated FTM drag artist whose performances captivated standing-room only Music Hall audiences throughout Great Britain. Born into working-class poverty, Vesta never went to school and instead was employed in the theatre from an early age. A singer, actor, dancer and mime, Vesta's first male impersonation, at the age of 6 was known as "The Pocket Sim Reeves." Among Vesta's greatest hits was, "Following in Father's Footsteps." Throughout Vesta's career (1868-1920) s/he crossdressed on stage and in silent movies and used all the resources at his command to break through or manipulate the barriers of class and gender which were so powerfully oppressive to working-class women in Victorian and Edwardian Britain. In 1894, Vesta made a first trip to America, performing at Pastors. In 1987-8 Vesta toured his own Vaudeville Company in New York City. Both women and men loved Vesta's performances and s/he was courted as often by women as by men. Women of that period frequently named their daughters after Vesta Tilley. Eventually, Vesta married a Member of Parliament.

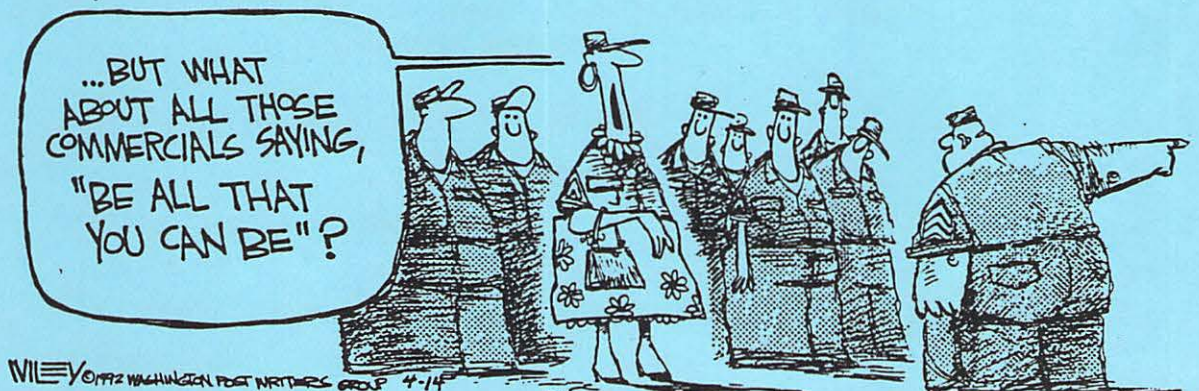
The very last song Vesta ever sang, at a farewell performance in 1920 was "Jolly Good Luck To The Girl Who Loves A Soldier." When Vesta reached the last chorus, his clear voice sang out, "Girls, if you want to love a soldier, you can all love ME." A gentleman's voice from the gallery boldly called out, "We do!"

To learn more about Vesta Tilley, read *Vesta Tilley*, by Sara Maitland, Virago Press, London, 1986. Maitland calls Tilley "The greatest of the gender-benders."

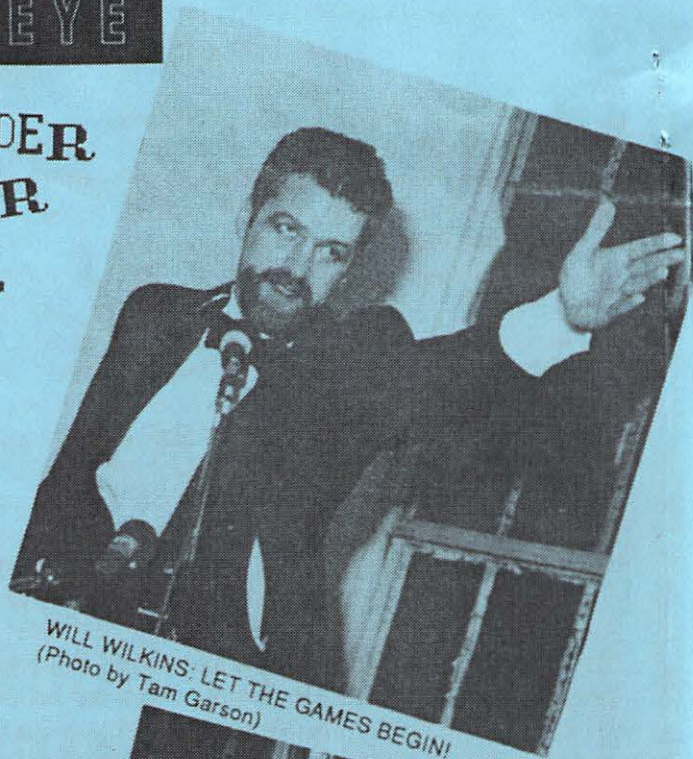
