

TRIAL OF ELLIS GLENN.

Case of the State Apparently Failing to Pieces.

PARKERSBURG, W. Va., July 19.—The principal witness in the Ellis Glenn case today was Philip White, of Marietta, who stated for the defense that he had been a companion of "Bert Glenn" in Marietta, and knew Bert Glenn was a man. The prisoner, Ellis Glenn, was not the same person, he declared. Bert Glenn had a bluish scar on his right arm, which he had seen many times. He had examined both arms of the defendant and there was no scar there.

Several witnesses stated that Ellis Glenn limped and Bert Glenn did not. C. D. Forrer testified that he knew Bert Glenn, and that he was positive that the prisoner was not the party. He said that she was not like Bert Glenn in any respect and her hair and eyes were of different color. The defense announced that it will spring a sensation in a few days, and this, it is believed, will be the production of the original Bert Glenn. The court has on several occasions in the past been thrown into excitement by rumors that Bert Glenn was in the room.
