Dear Lou:

Way back in Feb you wrote to me and I noted on the envelope; "answered March 9---; pretty quick for me. However as you are a rather unusual person I kept the letter around which I dont generally do. From the middle of Sept to the beginning of Nov I was out of the country--most of the time in China--so that when I returned there was a mountain of mail to take care of. I have just this morning knocked off the last of that mountain and there under it all I found your earlier letter which I reread.

In it you inquired whether I would be interested in reprinting some of your earlier articles. I first must tell you that I am no longer the Editor and Publisher of Transvestia having terminated those efforts after 20 years with issue #100. I sold the business to a TV friend of mine and she has brought out 101 102 and 103 since. However I think she would be much interested in an article by you and about a female TV. However you indicate that your previous articles were for a gay journal and that you regard yourself as a gay man. Thus the articles might well have a different slant than would be of most interest to our readers. I wouldnt be interested in a "gee dont I pass good" article as you put it. But I think something giving a bit of your history, your fantasies and feelings about dressing and passing as a man plus some events encountered while so attired would be very interesting to our people as a contrast yst parallel situation to their own. If your former articles would do that, o.k. but if that was not their slant then

it would be; much appreciated if you could whip off a new article for us. All of our material is submitted by our readers for the general interest of all so there wouldnt be any payment involved, but I am sure Carol (the current Editor) would be happy to send you a copy of the issue the article appears in. If you would be willing to do so please send it to me and I will forward it to her. I would like to read it myself first as I might as Emeritus editor, want to append a commentary to appear with it. Not a criticism dont misunderstand me, but a commentary to our people of the parallels and differences etc.

You indicated that you wanted to be taken for a gay man which seems sort of strange to me. I could easier understand your being heterosexual and yet wishing to appear and pass as a man in mens clothes as that is the reverse of the coin for male TVs. But not having a penis which is the principle object of interest to gay males how could you perform. They could not perform fellatio on you tho you could on them to be sure. Yet for them to perform sodomy on you when a perfectly useful vagina is stright around in front; would not seem to be as satisfactory to you and probably not for them. So why do you not seek straight men who might buy the gender change and still be able to make out with you sexually as anatomy dictates? A clarification of this would be interesting
